

BROOMFIELD'S CITY & COUNTY GOVERNMENT

Since November of 1974, Broomfield has had a council-manager form of municipal government. The Mayor and ten-member City Council serve as the policy-making officers of the City and County. Two council members are elected from each of five wards within the City and County and serve staggered four-year terms. The Mayor, who is elected at-large, serves a two-year term. City Council meetings are held on the second and fourth Tuesdays of each month.

The City Council appoints a City and County Manager to serve as the chief executive and administrative officer of the City and County. The City and County Manager is responsible for: preparation of the annual budget; planning, directing, and coordinating all phases of municipal/county operations; assisting all departments in coordinating existing programs and implementing new City Council decisions and directives; responding to requests from residents for information and services; and evaluating all City and County programs and operations. The Deputy City and County Manager, Assistant City and County Manager and all department heads are appointed by the City and County Manager and report directly to him, except the City and County Attorney and Presiding Municipal Judge who are appointed by and report to City Council.
