



# **JOB ANNOUNCEMENT**

## **JUNIOR PARK RANGER PROGRAM (#2010-0025)**

**Posted: February 23, 2010**

### What is the Junior Park Ranger Program?

The Junior Park Ranger Program is designed to provide job opportunities for Broomfield youth. Working under a Senior Park Ranger, Junior Park Rangers assist Park Maintenance crews by performing necessary non-technical tasks to provide Broomfield residents with a well-maintained park system and to allow Park Maintenance crews to focus on more technical duties.

### What work will the Ranger do?

Rangers will be involved in litter pick-up, cleaning of public facilities and restrooms, pulling weeds, and emptying trash cans as well as other related duties as required.

### Who is eligible to be a Junior Park Ranger?

Rangers must be Broomfield residents who are 14, 15, 16, or 17 years old on the date of hire.

### How much would I be paid?

Rangers are paid \$7.28 per hour.

### When and where would I work?

Four different crews (with 4 youth on each crew) are currently being hired to work Monday – Friday, 6/01 – 7/02 or 7/06 – 8/06. The designated work times and sites where each crew reports for work are listed below. At the end of the shift, the crew will be dropped back at the pick-up site. Rangers are responsible for arranging their own transportation to and from the pick-up site.

### Can I work on more than one crew?

Because we are trying to employ as many youth as possible, you will only be allowed to work on one crew unless an insufficient number of applicants are available.

### What if I am late?

If you do not arrive by your designated pick-up time, you would be keeping the other members of your crew from doing their work. So, your supervisor will not be able to wait for you. Unfortunately for us and for you, you will be considered absent and will not be paid for that day.

### What does a Ranger wear to work?

Each Ranger will be issued a pair of gloves and three tee-shirts. The Ranger will be expected to wear one of the tee-shirts while working to identify him or her as a Junior Park Ranger. Additionally, the Rangers must wear straight-cut jeans (boot cut is acceptable) or pants. No shorts or cut-offs will be permitted. Socks and shoes that cover the feet must also be worn.

### What if it is raining or I can't come to work?

If it is raining or if it looks like it is going to rain, call the Park Maintenance Shop (303-438-6358) to see if the crew will be working that day. The Park Maintenance Shop is open from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Due to the short length of the Ranger program, Rangers will not be allowed more than two days of absence during the session, regardless of the reason. The only exception will be for an absence due to a death in the family.

If you will be absent, you should contact the Park Maintenance shop before you are scheduled to be picked up. A Ranger will not be paid for any day on which he or she does not work.

### How do I apply for a job as a Junior Park Ranger?

Applications should be completed on-line at [www.broomfield.org/jobs](http://www.broomfield.org/jobs) Applications will not be accepted after the deadline of **5:00 p.m. on Thursday, April 15, 2010**. Residency will be verified and selection of Junior Park Rangers will be through a **random drawing**. If an email address is provided, applicants will be notified as to their status no later than Friday, May 7th. The selected Junior Park Rangers must then, as a condition of employment, pass a drug screen prior to hire.

### Directions To Pick-Up/Drop-Off Sites:

**Crew #1 -- Girl Scout Shelter in Midway Park** --From Midway and Main, go West on Midway to Midway Park. The shelter is located on the West end of the park on the North side of Midway.

**Crew #2 -- Trails Park Shelter** -- From Midway and Lowell, go North on Lowell to Trails Drive (just North of the Paul Derda Recreation Center). Then go East on Trails Drive about 2 blocks to the park shelter.

**Crew #3 -- Northmoor Park Shelter** -- From Midway and Sheridan, go North on Sheridan to 13th Avenue. Then go West on 13th Avenue 4 blocks to the park shelter. (It is next to Bal Swan Children's Center.)

**Crew #4 -- Lac Amora Park Shelter** -- From State Highway 287 and 10th Avenue, go West on 10th about 1/2 mile. 10th Avenue curves around to the North. The park shelter is on the East side of 10th Avenue.

**Crew #5 -- Zang Spur Park** -- From State Highway 287 and 10th Avenue, go West on 10th Avenue about 3 blocks. The park is on the North side of 10th Avenue. Meet in the parking lot by the Depot Museum.

**Crew #6 -- Community Center Entrance** --From Midway and Main Street, go East on Midway to Lamar. Go South on Lamar about 3 blocks. The Community Center is on the East side of Lamar.

**Crew #7 -- Westlake Middle School** -- From Midway and Lowell, go North on Lowell to Westlake Drive. Then go East on Westlake Drive. Follow it to 135th Avenue. Go East on 135th Avenue 2 blocks to the school. Meet in front of the school.

**Crew #8 -- Outlook Park Shelter** -- From Midway and Main, go North on Main to 136th Avenue. Go West on 136th Avenue 1 short block. The park shelter is on the North side of 136th Avenue.
